



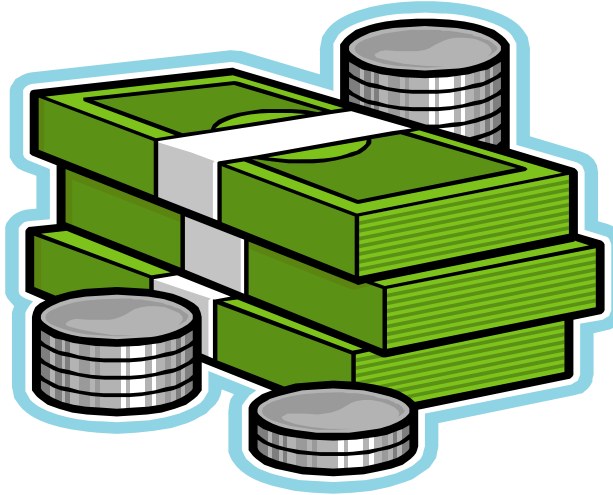

For some young men and women, the **Summer Youth Program** means a chance to:

- \$ earn the income they need to stay in school, or
- \$ go back to school, or
- \$ it provides the opportunity to acquire the work experience necessary for regular employment.

Program goals for participants in this program include, but are not limited to:

- \$ Providing participants with an opportunity to raise the level of their work experience, or work skills.
- \$ Encouraging participants to remain in school and complete their education.
- \$ Introducing participants to the world-of-work and opportunities for learning the basic work maturity skills that are required for all employees or participants in the work force.
- \$ Providing participants with an opportunity to be successful in making the transition from school to work, or post-secondary education.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What kinds of jobs are available?

Youth workers will be matched with opportunities in their communities. Most jobs will be in government agencies or nonprofits. You might be: shelving books in a library and reading to preschoolers; maintaining a school building; sorting clothing for a shelter; or helping bag groceries at the food pantry.

What hours would I work?

Hours depend on the needs of your worksite. Generally people work from 8:30am until 5pm, with a half-hour lunch break. You will not be assigned to work weekends.

Can I attend summer school and still work?

Yes, if you need to make up credits, you are urged to attend summer school. Work can be scheduled around your school hours.

Who is eligible?

There are eligibility guidelines based on family income during the past six months. If a family member has been out of work during that time, you might be eligible. You also might be eligible if your family receives Food Stamps or if you have a disability.

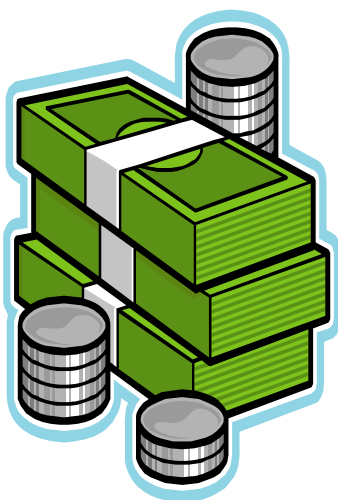
